AUTHORITY COMMENT Church 943 10538 Mynachlog Ddu 115 No. 1 The church of St. Dogmael is double-aisled; it was restored in 1888. On each side of the communion table is a carved stone corbel for images, and at the east end of the side aisle there is a small aumbrey and a corbel for an image. Plain pointed arches divide the aisles. There is a Norman font, but the pedestal is modern. We could find no trace of the old grange, where there was a chapel of St. Giles. The only suggestion of antiquity was an old foundation at the back of a small cottage, now used as a store-room, close to the gate of the churchyard.
