## AUTHORITY

Viewed in late spring, 1979 - In the NE quadrant, several clearly defined rings of nettles, c. 3½ - 4 m diameter may reflect habitation (?)

A low marshy area at the S. end of the cross-bank (reportedly a well) has become the last resting place of "several" carcasses of cows

This is probably the largest camp in Pembrokeshire. A single bank encloses an area of 4 acres, which is divided into 2 equal parts by a chevron shaped bank. Near the south western junction of these banks is a deep depression with a pit in the centre, which contains water in the winter, though after this dry summer (1899) it was empty. The farm and the greater part of the camp belongs to Mr. Hughes of Alltllwyd, Cards. but the moiety of the camp belongs to Mr. Bowen of Llwyngwair. In a field to the south of the camp was ploughed up an iron spearhead with a sharp spike to fit into a socket in the shaft. Perhaps the weapon of a High Sheriff's javelin man.
