

CAS REPORT IS AT VARIANCE WITH O.T. JONES IN STATING THAT 'MAIN ADIT AND WORKINGS (ARE) EAST OF HENDRE FELIN'. THE MAIN WORKINGS ARE WEST OF HENDRE-FELIN FARMSTEAD AS INDICATED ON 1ST EDITION O.S. 1:2500 SURVEY CARDS XVI.7. FURTHER DETAIL IS INDICATED ON THE O.S. 2ND EDITION 1:2500 SURVEY. THE WORKINGS TO THE NORTH OF HENDRE-FELIN COMPRISE OF AN ADIT PROBABLY DRIVEN WITH THE INTENTION OF MEETING THE MAIN SHAFT SOME 700 YARDS TO THE SOUTH-WEST BUT IT IS NOT KNOWN WHETHER THIS WAS ACHIEVED. THE MINE WAS NOT SUCCESSFUL AND IS CLASSIFIED AS A TRIAL WORKING - ONLY 20 TONS OF ORE WERE RETURNED IN 1870. THE CAS REPORT DOES NOT APPEAR TO DRAW ON ANY SOURCES BEYOND BICK I, 1976 AND SHOULD NOT BE RELIED UPON PARTICULARLY IN ITS CONCLUSION IN STATING THAT 'THERE ARE NO REMAINING STANDING STRUCTURES'.
