A very spread mound (c. 30m in diameter and 50 cm high) with an evenly rounded profile and crossed by a field boundary; the N half is the better preserved. The owner of the field in which the N. half falls, Mr. Wheeler, "Hafod Wen", stated that it had been cut into c. 1980 for a pipe trench, and a layer or "floor" of round stones had been exposed. There are no traces of a ditch.

On the other side of the field boundary, in a field belonging to Mr. Luke, Maenpica, there is only a faint swelling. A N/S field boundary once met the E/W field boundary at about this point, but has been removed ^{and} and there is no trace of it.

Flat-topped Round barrow, c. 0.5 metres high, c. 30 metres in diameter, cut across its centre by a roughly East-west running hedge. Mound best preserved on the N. side of the hedge, while the S. side only shows up as a slight ground swelling.
