A Shell Midden Pembroke Dock

Known locally as Cockleshell Island
In the local dialect this is a misken

Midden dimensions

- Os Map reference SR 985035
- This should bring you to an inlet called Cosheston Pill. On the south shore of this pill are three tributaries. Cockleshell Island lies on the eastern point of the western most tributary.
- 45 paces long by 13paces wide .
- On approaching it is first seen as a green mound.
- On going round to the seaward side, erosion has exposed the layers of mostly European Oyster (Ostrea edulis) and occasional Queen Scallop (possibly Chlamys Opercularis or C Varia) shells.
