OBSERVATION POST OPENED: Sept 1941

IDENTITY (IE 'CALL SIGN'):

Sept 1941 - Nov 1953 28.1/Y4

Nov 1953 – Oct 1968 13/A1

Oct 1968 - 1982 13/C1 (admin Identity only – not used operationally)

1982 Letter/Number identities ceased – Operational Numbers only used

OPERATIONAL NUMBERS: (Introduced for data processing)

Dec 1967 – Oct 1968 13/ (Number unknown)

Oct 1968 – 1982 13/20

1982 - Sep 1991 13/27

TYPE OF CONSTRUCTION:

Sept 1941 – May 1945 – Standard Hut + commencing with Self-Build

Replaced if required by permanent structure during war.

May 1945 – Jan 1947 Site not officially used

Jan 1947 - 1959 Original Observation Post reused.

Dec 1959 – 1982 Standard ROC Monitoring Post in use.

1982 - Sept 1991 Standard ROC Monitoring Post in use.

(Was this the original or a replacement?)

HEIGHT above Sea level of Monitoring Post + 300ft (91m from 1987)

COMMUNICATIONS:

Landline Sept 1941 – Sep 1991

Sept 1941 - 1960 ish Field Telephone using switched public lines.

1960'ish 1981 AD3460 Teletalk

1981 – Sep 1991 AD8010 Loudspeaker Telephone

1982 Private Wire installed (Circuit No 20203)
