
Concern for historic Five Arches

HEALTH and safety concerns at Tenby's historic Five Arches have been raised for the second time in less than three years.

Last Wednesday, Pembrokeshire County Council announced that scaffolding has been erected on one of the arches.

The scaffolding will remain in place while the authority undertakes further investigations.

Council spokesman Len Mullins said: "The concerns centre on the quality of some of the stonework, especially in the dry weather conditions."

The same arch was cordoned off in September 2015 after an incident when a piece of stone fell onto the footway.

It re-opened after an inspection by a structural engineer.
