

New plaque honours soldiers

A NEW plaque has been unveiled at Cardigan War Memorial to honour three fallen soldiers from the town.

The plaque commemorates Michael J. Dunphy, who gave his life in the 1982 Falklands War, and Lee T. Davies and David M. E. Greenhaigh, who gave their lives in the war in Afghanistan.

The plaque was unveiled by Lord Lieutenant of Dyfed, Sara Edwards.

Councillor Paul Hinge, Ceredigion Council's Armed Forces Champion, said: "It was an honour and privilege to welcome everyone to the service of commemoration and dedication, not only as a son of Cardigan, but as a veteran myself and Ceredigion County Council's Armed Forces Champion."
