# **Photographic Survey**

Conversion and end extension of former dynamite/gun powder store to 1-bed self-catered holiday let and new build bat roost/log store at Glan y Llyn, Mynachlogddu, Clunderwen,

Pembrokeshire, SA66 7RU



#### 1. Introduction

This Survey is submitted following the granting of planning permission for the conversion of the existing outbuilding at Glan Llyn under planning reference NP/19/0392/FUL.

Condition No. 8 of this approval requires the submission and approval of an appropriate photographic survey in accordance with guidelines provided by Dyfed Archaeological Trust, prior to the commencement of development. This Survey is submitted in order to discharge that Condition and thus enable development to commence. All photos included were taken on 24<sup>th</sup> June 2020 in light and clear conditions.


#### 2. Site Context

The outbuilding is located on the eastern side of the minor road linking Mynachlogddu (north) to Efailwen on the A487 (south). The site is triangular in shape, laid to hardcore/grassland with a stone and slated outbuilding located centrally along the western roadside boundary. The immediate site is level, bounded by banked hedgerow and low stone wall. It is accessed from the adjacent road to the west.

The outbuilding is believed to have been originally used as a dynamite/gun powder store, in association with the adjoining hard rock quarry, which is long since disused. The building is of a simple and modest traditional character, with one single vaulted square room internally with exposed trusses. It is constructed of local cut stone (most likely from the quarry itself), with a natural slate pitched roof running from north east to south west.


























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
