#### 1. Summary

- 1.1 This historic environment appraisal has been undertaken by Trysor to examine likely impacts on the historic environment from a proposed wind turbine, Celt1, Llanddarog, Carmarthenshire.
- 1.2 The appraisal has looked at all known historic assets within an area measuring 2km in radius, focused on SN4980218958, the location of the proposed turbine, consulting the regional Historic Environment Record and the National Monuments Record, as well as examining historic maps. A field visit was also undertaken to examine the location of the turbine and record previously unknown historic assets.
- 1.3 The appraisal shows that there is no surface evidence of buried archaeological features at the proposed development site.
- 1.4 No Scheduled Ancient Monuments within the 2km appraisal area would be affected by the proposed turbine. Five Scheduled Ancient Monuments between 2km and 5km from the proposed turbine would experience a Very Low, indirect visual impact due to intervisibility with the proposed turbine at distance. No Listed Buildings within the 2km appraisal area would be affected by the development.
- 1.5 The proposed turbine would be visible from the adjacent Tywi Valley Historic Landscape Area, as well as the Paxton's Tower Historic Park & Garden, although it lies outside both areas.
- 1.6 The appraisal shows that no direct, physical impact or significant indirect, visual impact would be caused to the historic environment by the proposed turbine.
- 1.7 On the basis of this appraisal, no archaeological mitigation is thought necessary for the proposed development.

#### 3. Introduction

- 3.1 Charlotte Norton of Seren Energy, 1, High Street, Clydach, Swansea, SA65LG commissioned Trysor heritage consultants to write an Historic Environment Appraisal for a proposed turbine known as Celt1, on farmland adjacent to Blaenpibwr, Llanddarog Road, Llanddarog Carmarthenshire, SA32 8AW.
- 3.2 Dyfed Archaeological Trust Heritage Management section has written a generic brief for such appraisals (DAT HM, Undated). These appraisals are intended to be a rapid appraisal of the readily available historic environment information including a site visit. The purpose of the appraisal is to inform DAT HM as to whether any further assessment or evaluation would be required as part of the planning process. Trysor prepared a specification based on the brief (Trysor, 2014) and Dyfed Archaeological Trust Heritage Management section approved the specification as fit for purpose.



#### 4. The proposed development




Figure 1: Location of the proposed turbine, showing the 2km radius appraisal area.

4.1 It is proposed that a turbine, with a hub height of 50m, and 74m to the upright blade tip, will be located at approximately SN4980218958 on farmland adjacent to Blaenpibur, see Figure 1.

#### 5. Methodology

- 5.1 A study area of 2km radius circle centred on SN4980218958, the proposed turbine site, was chosen for the initial appraisal of sites. This area was not revised.
- 5.2 The HER enquiry for an area of 2km radius, centred on SN4980118956, yielded 105 records. Four of these actually lay outside the appraisal area and were removed from the dataset. A further record was a duplicate record and was also removed. This left 100 records within the initial project dataset.
- 5.3 Within the 100 records, there was one Scheduled Ancient Monument and seven Listed Buildings.
- 5.4 A site visit was made to the site of the proposed turbine on June 13th, 2014 to rapidly appraise if there were any visible archaeological features within the area directly affected by the turbine proposal and also the wider landscape context of the proposed development. The field was under pasture at the time and the surface of the field was only partially visible.
- 5.5 Seren Energy also requested that an appraisal was undertaken of impacts on Scheduled Ancient Monuments within a 5km radius of the proposed turbine. This identified eight Scheduled Ancient Monuments and found that no significant impact would be felt on these monuments if the proposed turbine was constructed. The results of this appraisal are found in Appendix D of this report.
- 5.6 The aerial photographs on Google Earth, dating to 2006 and 2009, were used to inform the appraisal.
- 5.7 Historic mapping was consulted. The maps used included 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century 1:2500 scale Ordnance Survey mapping and the Llanarthne parish tithe map of 1849 and accompanying tithe schedule of 1847.
- 5.8 All information gathered during the desktop appraisal and fieldwork was entered into a bespoke database in Access 2003 format to create an appraisal dataset. The dataset is the source of the material output in this report, including the GIS mapping which illustrates the location of sites in the area, and the tables and appendices which provide detailed information on the sites within the study area.
- 5.9 At the end of a rapid appraisal of the data, the information from the site visit and historic map search, the appraisal dataset contained 101 records.
  - 5.9.1 One new record was created in the project database by Trysor. This was for a former road/track (ID numbers 101).




Figure 2: The 2km appraisal area showing significance of sites, labelled with Project ID number

5.10 Each of the records in the final appraisal dataset was assessed for Period, Rarity, Documentation, Group Value<sup>1</sup>, as well as Evidential Value, Historical Value, Aesthetic Value, Communal Value<sup>2</sup>. Once these had been considered the significance of each site was determined and scored in accordance with the categories adopted by the Welsh Archaeological Trusts i.e. Nationally Important, Regionally Important, Locally Important, Minor and Features Needing Further Investigation (Unknown), see Figure 2. Full details of this exercise are given in Appendix C.

5.11 As this exercise is an appraisal of the study area, not a full desk-based historic environment assessment, no site descriptions have been included in the appraisal dataset or this printed report, apart from newly recorded features (See Appendix B).

#### 6. Celt1 Historical Overview

#### 6.1 Map evidence

- 6.1.1 The Ordnance Survey's Original Surveyors Drawings of 1813, which was the first detailed map made of the country, shows that the area in which the development is to take place was already enclosed and farmed by the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. A dwelling known as Blaenpibwr is shown to the west-southwest, which may have been associated with the fields around the development site at this early date. The 1 inch to 1 mile scale Ordnance Survey map of 1831 shows a similar picture.




Figure 3: A section of the Llanarthne parish tithe map of 1849. The fields belonging to Gelliaur are shaded in blue. The turbine would stand in parcel 475.

- 6.1.2 The Llanarthne parish tithe map of 1849 was the first map to depict the field system at and around the development site. The tithe map shows that the fields here were part of a farmstead known as *Gellyaur* (see Figure 3). The homestead is shown on the tithe map as being located in field parcel 464, which appears to be the same location as Blaenpibwr on earlier maps. The accompanying tithe schedule, which was drawn up in 1847, records that the property at that time was 45 acres in extent and occupied by one Thomas Evans. This Thomas Evans is recorded as a Farmer at Blaenpibwr on the 1841 Llanarthne parish census returns. He is also shown on the 1851 parish census, farming 45 acres at the holding known as *Pibwr or Gellyair*. This confirms that Gelliaur and Blaenpibwr are likely to be the same property, for which alternative names were used during the 19<sup>th</sup> century.
- 6.1.3 The field parcels shown at the holding on the tithe map were almost identical in form to those present in the modern landscape, with the exception of the field proposed as a site for the wind turbine, where a single field parcel has been created by the amalgamation of three small parcels shown on the tithe map. Although the tithe schedule records field names where they were in use, field parcel 475, the site of the proposed turbine, was an unnamed pasture field, see Table 1. Of the remaining fields on the holding, none had names recorded which were of archaeological significance.
- 6.1.4 The next detailed map of Blaenpibwr/Gelliaur is the Ordnance Survey's 1:2500 scale map published in 1887. This shows the field system very much as it was on the parish tithe map. At this time the farmstead was named Blaenpibwr, a name which was retained until relatively recent times. Subsequent Ordnance Survey maps, down to the late 20<sup>th</sup> century show the same picture. The farmhouse and outbuildings are now detached from most of the farmland and the dwelling is known as Pibwr Cottage, being part of a much reduced land holding.

#### 7. Celt1: Proposed turbine site

- 7.1 The proposed turbine is to be located at SN4980218958 in a pasture field. The proposed site plan supplied by Seren Energy is in Appendix E.
- 7.2 The turbine will require a foundation hole, which will be cut through the ploughsoil and into the subsoil. An area of hardstanding will be created to the southwest of the turbine base, for a turning and storage area. Access will be via an existing trackway (ID number 101), which will use existing gateways but require some widening. A short section of new trackway, c.220 metres long, will be created from the end of the existing track to the turbine location. The line of the cable trench has not been established, nor has it been decided whether the electricity cables would be buried or carried overground from the turbine site.

#### 8. Impact Assessment

- 8.1 When the proposed development site and its environs were visited in June 2014, an assessment was made of the intervisibility of key monuments in the local landscape with the turbine site. This assessment was undertaken on a clear day, with good visibility.
- 8.2 Within the appraisal area a total of 101 sites were recorded in the final appraisal database.




Figure 4: The 2km appraisal area showing impact on sites recorded, labelled with Project ID number

- 8.3 The Direct and Indirect impact on each site was assessed taking into account both physical and non-physical impacts. Each impact was assessed within the scale Very Low, Low, Moderate, High and Very High, taken into account the significance of the site and the nature of the impact. A full table is found in Appendix A but a summary is tabulated in Table 2 below and illustrated in Figure 4.
- 8.4 As Table 2 and Appendix A show, no recorded historic assets within the area of the appraisal were determined to be exposed to any significant impact from the proposed turbine development. (Details of the appraisal for direct and indirect impact for each of the sites in Table 2 can be found in Appendix A).
- 8.5 An examination of the proposed location of the turbine foundation hole and hardstanding area identified no evidence of surface material of archaeological interest. The land was under pasture with very little exposure of the underlying soil surface.
- 8.6 Access to the turbine site would be gained via an existing farm trackway (ID number 101). The line of the trackway was walked during the field visit and no features of archaeological interest were noted along its course. This trackway will require some widening, but this would not result in any significant impact as it is essentially a modern farm trackway for most of its length. It will be extended by some 220 metres at its eastern end, but this would not impact on any historic field boundaries. The access trackway would use existing gateways along its route.
- 8.7 The line of any overhead cables or cable trench which would be required to connect the proposed turbine to the national grid has not yet been decided. No features of archaeological interest were noted within the field where the turbine would stand, or in surrounding fields, that would be of concern from an archaeological perspective. A cable trench could cut through historic field boundaries, but this can be avoided by either running the cable through existing gateways between fields or by boring the cable trench beneath boundary banks, instead of cutting through them.

#### 9. Historic Landscape Aspects Relating to the Celt1 Proposed Turbine

**9.1** The following aspects of the historic environment around the Celt1 proposed turbine site have also been considered by this appraisal, as required by the brief supplied by the Dyfed Archaeological Trust Heritage Management Section (DAT, HM, Undated);

#### 9.2 Scheduled Ancient Monuments in their settings

9.2.1 There is only one Scheduled Ancient Monument within the appraisal area, namely a damaged round barrow at Maes y Crug (ID number 7). Half of this barrow was destroyed in the 19<sup>th</sup> century when a railway line was built through it. The surviving portion of the barrow lies to the north of a former railway embankment and mature hedgerow, which would block views southwards towards the turbine. Potential impacts on Scheduled Ancient Monuments are included in Appendix A and Table 3.

9.2.2 Seren Energy requested that Trysor undertook a further impact assessment in relation to Scheduled Ancient Monuments within a 5km radius of the turbine site. This identified a further eight Scheduled Ancient Monuments (in addition to the single site mentioned in 9.2.1 above). The results of this appraisal are found in Appendix D of this report. It is shown that five of the extra eight Scheduled Ancient Monuments would be exposed to a Very Low, indirect, visual impact, due to intervisibility with the turbine at distance, with no impacts on the settings of the monuments.

#### 9.3 Previously Recorded Non-designated Historic Assets in their settings

Three Non-designated Historic Assets in the appraisal area are thought likely to experience a Very Low indirect, visual impact. These are the former railway station at Nantgaredig (ID number 40), Abercothi Mansion (ID number 48) and the Railway Hotel public house at Nantgaredig (ID number 86). It is thought that the turbine would be visible from these sites, but at distance and with no impact on their settings. Potential impacts on Non-scheduled Ancient Monuments are included in Appendix A and Table 4. The significance of Non-scheduled Ancient Monuments is addressed in Appendix C.

#### 9.4 Newly identified sites of historic importance

Only one historic asset was recorded during the appraisal. This is a former road (ID number 101), which ran west-to east across the former farmstead of Blaenpibwr during the first part of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, as shown on the 1813 Ordnance Survey Original Surveyors Drawings. It had apparently fallen out of use as a road by the time of the 1849 parish tithe map, but its western half is still used as a farm trackway and it would be used to give access to the proposed turbine site. The western end of the surviving trackway is metalled and along its course it is relatively wide, with farm gates at intervals. It is unlikely that the development would have a negative impact along its course. The details of this site are included in Appendices A, B & C.

#### 9.6 Registered Parks & Gardens and their essential settings.

There are no Registered Parks and Gardens within the revised study area.

9.6.1 The Middleton Hall Historic Park & Garden (PGW (Dy) 4(CAM)) lies very close to the southeastern edge of the 2km appraisal area. The nature of the local topography means that the proposed turbine would not be visible from the core of this Historic Park & Garden, including the area of surviving, listed, estate buildings. There may be a partial view of the turbine blades in the immediate vicinity of the modern glass dome at the heart of the National Botanical Gardens, in an area that has been re-landscaped in modern times. This view would include the modern Botanical Gardens office building and would not impact on historic park and garden features. The significant views from the core of the Park & Garden at Middleton have been identified by Cadw (Cadw, Register of Historic Parks & Gardens dataset, provided in 2014), as being between the northeast and south-southeast. This means that the significant views are in the opposite direction, away from the proposed turbine site, which lies to the northwest.

9.6.2 The smaller Paxton's Tower Historic Park & Garden (PGW (Dy) 4(CAM)) lies further away, 4.2km to the east of the proposed turbine site. The turbine would be visible from Paxton's Tower and the western part of its Historic Park & Garden, but would lie outside the areas described as the significant view of the tower, as defined by Cadw. These are focused on the Tywi Valley, to the north of the tower, and range from the west-northwest to the northeast.

#### 9.7 Registered Historic Landscapes

- 9.7.1 The turbine site itself does not lie in a Registered Historic Landscape. The northern and eastern part of the appraisal area do, however, lay within the Tywi Valley Historic Landscape. The boundary of the Tywi Valley Historic Landscape, as defined by the current boundaries supplied by Cadw, lies 200 metres to the north of the proposed turbine location at its closest.
- 9.7.2 There is a discrepancy between the boundaries of the Tywi Valley Historic Landscape as defined by Cadw, and those defined by the Dyfed Archaeological Trust when they undertook the detailed Tywi Valley Historic Landscape characterisation exercise for Cadw over a decade ago. Recent email correspondence with Cadw (email to Trysor on July 31st 2014) has established that this discrepancy will remain unresolved for the foreseeable future.
- 9.7.3 As a result of the discrepancy between the Cadw and Dyfed Archaeological Trust boundaries for the Tywi HLC area, the Dyfed boundary lies 370 metres to the northwest of the proposed turbine site at its closest point. For the purposes of an Archaeological Appraisal, the characterisation boundaries created by the Dyfed Archaeological Trust have always been used as they include all the areas for which detailed landscape characterisation has been undertaken. There is no data available for areas outside the Dyfed Archaeological Trust historic landscape characterisation boundaries against which impacts can be assessed.
- 9.7.4 The 2km radius appraisal area touches upon five Tywi Valley Historic Landscape Characterisation Areas. These areas include relatively large parts of three HLC areas;
  - 185. Llangynwr-Llanarthne Parishes
  - 182. Ystrad Tywi: Carmarthen-Llandeilo
  - 191. Nantgaredig-Derwen Fawr



The proposed turbine would be visible from about 50% of the landscape within the Llangynwyr-Llanarthe HLC area, and from most of the landscape of the portions of the other two HLC area which fall within the 2km appraisal area.

Much smaller portions of two other areas fall within the appraisal area and the proposed turbine would in general not be visible from within these areas;

187. Croesyceiliog-Cwmffrwd 189. Llanarthne.

For the individual character areas, the proposed turbine would cause an indirect, visual impact.

#### 9.8 Non-registered Historic Landscapes

9.8.1 The existing Unitary Development Plan (UDP) for Carmarthenshire was adopted in 2006. It includes a definition of several Special Landscape Areas (SLAs) within the county. The Tywi Valley Special Landscape Area is defined by the boundaries of the Tywi Valley Historic Landscape Area, as defined by Cadw. The proposed turbine site lies some 200 metres to the south of this boundary.

9.8.2 The UDP is soon to be superseded by the Local Development Plan (LDP), drafted in 2011 but not yet adopted. The LDP includes a revision of the boundaries of the Tywi Valley SLA. The proposed boundaries are based on those of LANDMAP Visual & Sensory Aspect Areas, which have been chosen in order to provide a more robust justification for the definition of the SLA. The proposed SLAs are focused on the valley floor and the valley sides, and include;

CRMRTVS311 – Tywi Valley Flood Plain CRMRTVS970 – Northern Slopes of the Tywi Valley Flood Plain CRMRTVS274 – Southern Slopes of the Tywi Valley Flood Plain

These proposed SLAs specifically exclude areas outside the valley which "simply enjoy views into the valley", including the area around the turbine site, which would lay c.1km to the south of the nearest proposed SLA (CRMRTVS274).

#### 9.9 LANDMAP and landscape characterisation information

The proposed turbine would stand at the eastern end of the linear Mynydd Cyfor, Pant-y-Parchell LANDMAP Historic Landscape Aspect Area (CRMRTHL39607). This part of the character area is defined by medium-sized, irregular fields whereas the central part has regular fields. The whole area is a typical Carmarthenshire agricultural landscape. The most significant archaeological element is Iron Age and Roman and medieval settlement. It has an overall evaluation of High. The landscape is described as "complete" with little modern development or intrusion to hinder the visibility of the overall landscape and its patterns. The proposed turbine would not have a significant impact on the essential character of the area, as the development would not disrupt the existing field boundaries or associated landscape elements that define this landscape.



#### 9.10 Conservation Area

There are no Conservation Areas within the revised study area.

#### 9.11 Tir Gofal interests or requirements

No Tir Gofal interests were identified.

#### 9.12 Buried archaeological potential

During the field visit, no physical, visible evidence was noted suggestive of significant buried archaeology at the proposed development site. There is also no documentary, cartographic or aerial photographic evidence of buried archaeology at the proposed location for the turbine.

#### 9.13 Palaeoenvironmental potential

No palaeoenvironmental potential can be identified at the Celt1 turbine site. It is situated in a pasture field.

#### 9.14 Hedgerows and field patterns

The proposed development would be located in a pasture field, which had been enclosed by the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. The area was shown as enclosed farmland on the 1813 Ordnance Survey Original Surveyors Drawings and the field boundaries have changed little, in terms of layout since the tithe survey of the 1840s, although the field in which the turbine would be located was formerly composed of three small field parcels, amalgamated into a single field during the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Today the fields are largely defined by low earthwork banks topped with hedgerows. The proposed development will not change the character of the field system or have any effect on any field boundary banks.

#### 9.15 Ancient woodland

There are two Ancient and Semi-natural Woodlands within the revised appraisal area. These are two small linear areas along tributaries on the west facing slope of the Tywi Valley. Both are located on the southern slopes of the Tywi valley the proposed turbine would not impact on these woodlands.

#### 9.16 Place-names

There are no significant place-names closely associated with the proposed turbine site.

#### **9.17** Cumulative impact

A single wind turbine was visible from the proposed development site when visited in June 2014. This was a recently erected 77 metre high turbine (to blade tip) at Nantycaws, c.3km to the southwest.

#### 9.18 National Park

Celt1 is not situated close to any National Park.





#### 10. Conclusion

- 10.1 There would not be a significant impact on the historic environment or on individual historic assets in relation to the proposed development of a wind turbine on farmland adjacent to Blaenpibwr.
- 10.2 There is one Scheduled Ancient Monument within the 2km appraisal area, namely the Maes-y-Crug round barrow (ID number 7), which would not be affected by the development. An appraisal of SAMs which lay between 2km and 5km from the proposed turbine site shows that five SAMs would experience a Very Low indirect, visual impact from the proposed turbine development, due to intervisibility at distance.
- 10.3 Of the seven Listed Buildings in the 2km appraisal area, not would be affected by the proposed turbine.
- 10.4 Two Historic Parks & Gardens lay outside the 2km appraisal area, namely Middleton Hall and Paxton's Tower. The settings of these Historic Parks & Gardens would not be affected by the development. The turbine would be visible from Paxton's Tower, but lay outside the area of significant views from the site.
- 10.5 The proposed turbine would be visible from parts of the Tywi Valley Historic Landscape Area, but would be located outside its boundaries.
- 10.6 Four non-designated historic assets would experience a Low or Very Low indirect impact, based on intervisibility with the turbine. These are Blaenpibwr trackway (ID number 101), the former Nantgaredig Railway Station (ID Number 40), the Railway Hotel at Nantgaredig (ID number 86), and Abercothi Mansion (ID number 48). The turbine would not affect the settings of these buildings.
- 10.7 On the basis of this appraisal there would be no significant direct or indirect impact on the historic environment from the proposed turbine. No archaeological mitigation is thought necessary.




Figure 5: Scheduled Ancient Monuments within 5km of the proposed turbine location.
