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1. Summary

This archaeological appraisal has been undertaken by Trysor to examine likely impacts on the historic environment from two proposed wind turbines on Drim Farm, near Llawhaden in Pembrokeshire (Drim Farm and Highfield).

The appraisal has looked at all known historic assets within a 2km radius of a central point between the proposed turbine sites, consulting the regional Historic Environment Record and the National Monuments Record, as well as examining historic maps. A field visit was also undertaken to examine the locations of each turbine and record previously unknown historic assets at each site.

The appraisal shows that no significant impact would be caused at the Drim Farm site and no mitigation would be necessary should the proposed turbine be installed. It also shows that there is moderate potential for an impact on historic assets at the Highfield site, where a Bronze Age round barrow lies in relatively close proximity to the proposed development and features such as a putative Roman Road, several Iron Age hillforts and a ruined cottage are also known nearby. Here mitigation is suggested, to ensure that the impact on the historic environment is minimised and any buried archaeological features would be recorded during development work.

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3. Introduction

Suzanne Love of Bowler Energy, Badgers Farm, Willow Pit Lane, Hilton, Derby DE65 5FN commissioned Trysor heritage consultants to write an Historic Environment Appraisal in advance of a proposed planning application for two wind turbines, one at Drim Farm, and one at neighbouring Highfield, near Llawhaden.

Dyfed Archaeological Trust Heritage Management section supplied a brief for the appraisal, (DAT HM, 2012), which was to be a rapid appraisal of the readily available historic environment information including a site visit. The purpose of the appraisal was to inform DAT HM as to whether any further assessment or evaluation would be required as part of the planning process.

4. The proposed development




Figure 1: Location of the two proposed turbines

It is proposed that an 11kw Gaia wind turbine, which has an 18m tower and blades of 13m diameter, will be located at SN0600219645 on Drim Farm. A second turbine, a 50kw Endurance Turbine, with a 24m or 36.5m tower and three blades of 19.2m diameter, is proposed for SN0666518595, at Highfield, see Figure 1.

Each turbine will require a foundation hole approximately 6 metres square and will serviced by cable trenches to nearby existing transformers.

5. Methodology

- 5.1 A study area of 2km radius circle centred on SN0658919135 was chosen for the initial appraisal of sites. This allowed inclusion of sufficient area around each turbine and extended as far south as Llawhaden Castle as requested by DAT HM, and as far east as the Cleddau.
- 5.2 The HER enquiry for this area yielded 96 records, with Cadw records showing 8 Scheduled monuments, and 15 Listed Buildings. Also included within the study area is the Llawhaden conservation area, defined as "an area of special architectural and historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance" (Planning (Listed buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990).
- 5.3 A site visit to Drim and Highfield was undertaken on 18th July 2012. Both locations were visited and features including relevant hedgebanks were recorded.
- 5.4 The aerial photographs on Google Earth, dating to 2006 and 2009, were used to inform the appraisal.
- 5.5 Historic mapping was consulted. The maps used included Ordnance Survey Original Surveyors Drawing, 19th and 20th century 1:2500 scale Ordnance Survey mapping and the Llawhaden parish tithe map of 1845 and tithe schedule of 1839.
- 5.6 The local history book "The Llawhaden Book" by Mary Houseman was also consulted. This book includes part of an 18th century map of the Drim estate, now kept at the National Library of Wales.
- 5.7 All information gathered during the desktop appraisal and fieldwork was entered into a bespoke database in Access 2003 format to create an appraisal dataset. The dataset is the source of the material output in this report, including the GIS mapping which illustrates the location of sites in the area, and the tables and appendices which provide detailed information on the sites within the study area.
- 5.8 At the end of a rapid assessment of the data, the information from the site visit and historic map search, the appraisal dataset contained 98 records. Some HER records were discarded as they were for deleted records or duplicate records, whilst some new records were created as a result of the desktop work and field survey undertaken by Trysor.
- 5.9 Each of the records in the appraisal dataset was assessed for Period, Rarity, Documentation, Group Value¹, as well as Evidential Value, Historical Value, Aesthetic Value, Communal Value². Once these had been considered the significance of each site was determined and scored in accordance with the categories adopted by the Welsh Archaeological Trusts i.e. Nationally Important, Regionally Important, Locally Important, Minor and Features Needing Further Investigation (Unknown). Full details of this exercise are given in Appendix F.
- 5.10 As this exercise in an appraisal of the study area, not a full desk-based archaeological assessment, no site descriptions have been included in the appraisal dataset or this printed report, apart from newly recorded features (See Appendix C).




Figure 1: Sites assessed within the 2km radius circle study area, showing their significance



6. Drim Farm proposed turbine site

- 6.1 The proposed turbine location at Drim is at SN0608219611, in a pasture field two fields to the west of the farm buildings at Drim. The proposed cable trench will run for c. 155 metres to the east southeast to SN0622219546. The cable will be connected to an existing transformer box which services a series of solar panels already installed in the adjacent field to the east.
- 6.2 Having studied the archaeological records, and current landscape context it was decided that a circle of 1km radius centred on the turbine at Drim, SN0608219611 should be appraised for impact from the proposed turbine. This area contains 12 sites recorded in the appraisal database.
- 6.3 The Direct and Indirect impact on each site was assessed taking into account both physical and non-physical impacts. A full table is found in Appendix A but a summary is tabulated in Table 1 below.
- 6.4 As Table 1 and Appendix A show, no archaeological sites within a 1km radius were determined to be exposed to any significant impact from the proposed turbine development. (Details of the appraisal for direct and indirect impact for each of the sites in Table 1 can be found in Appendix A).
- 6.5 The only direct, physical impact to a historic landscape feature would be to a short section of field boundary bank (ID number 92 in Table 1 and Appendix A). This only applies to groundworks for the cable trench which would cut through the earthwork boundary bank at one point. At the given grid reference there has previously been some disturbance of the hedgerow, and therefore the impact on the boundary bank will be slight.
- 6.6 It is not thought that there are any requirements for archaeological mitigation relating to any aspect of the proposed turbine site.




Figure 2: Assessment of the impact of the proposed turbine at Drim Farm on the recorded historic assets

7. Highfield proposed turbine site

- 7.1 The proposed turbine location at Highfield is at SN0666418596, on a southeast-facing slope, just below the highest point of a southwest to northeast running ridge. The top of the ridge reaches 103m in altitude, and the proposed turbine site lies at c.97m. The proposed cable trench will run for c. 170 metres to the west-southwest to SN0649518617 (pers. Comm. Mr Jonathan Mcnamara, Drim Farm), where it will be connected to an existing transformer box mounted on a wooden electricity pole.
- 7.2 Having studied the archaeological records, and current landscape context it was decided that a circle of 1.45km radius centred on the turbine at Highfield (SN0666418596) should be appraised for impact from the proposed turbine. This area includes Llawhaden Castle, as requested by the appraisal brief.
- 7.3 It was decided to revise the appraisal area and discount sites recorded within the Drim appraisal area to the northwest. These sites are situated to the northwest of the ridge of high ground and therefore would not be intervisible with, or affected by, the proposed turbine development. The revised area contains 40 sites recorded in the appraisal database.
- 7.4 The Direct and Indirect impact on each site was assessed taking into account both physical and non-physical impacts. A full table is found in Appendix B but a summary is tabulated below in Table 2.
- 7.5 As Table 2 and Appendix B show, two archaeological sites within a 1.45km radius were determined to be exposed to a moderate impact from the proposed turbine development. (Details of the appraisal for direct and indirect impact for each of the sites in Table 2 can be found in Appendix B). No other archaeological sites were determined to be exposed to any significant impact from the proposed turbine development.
- 7.6 The only direct, physical impact to a historic landscape feature would be to a short section of field boundary bank (ID number 93 in Table 2 and Appendix B). This only applies to groundworks for the cable trench which would cut into the earthwork boundary bank at one point. The impact on the boundary bank will be slight however.
- 7.7 The impact on the scheduled Iron Age hillfort at Broadway (ID number 5) would be limited to a direct visual impact on the site, due to the proximity and intervisibility between the proposed turbine site and the hillfort. There would be no direct or indirect physical impact on the hillfort however.
- 7.8 It is not thought that archaeological mitigation is required with regard to Broadway hillfort.
- 7.9 The impact on the Bronze Age round barrow at Highfield (ID number 32) includes direct visual impact, as it lies within the same field parcel as the proposed turbine site. The round barrow could also be exposed to potential indirect physical impact, as it lies between the access gates into the field and the proposed turbine site. It is not situated in a direct line between the gates and the development site, but might be at risk of being impacted upon by heavy machinery crossing the field.



- 7.10 The site is the only round barrow recorded within the 2km appraisal area, which enhances its archaeological significance. Historic ploughing has left the barrow mound in a denuded condition, but there is no evidence that subsurface archaeological features have been greatly disturbed and the monument may still have significant archaeological potential, particularly in terms of the survival of the burial cist and any associated features.
- 7.11 The present landowner has acquired the field in relatively recent times and was unaware of the existence of the Highfield round barrow at the time of the field visit. Raising awareness of the monument with the landowner would in itself help mitigate against the monument suffering unnecessary damage during any construction phase, servicing works or decommissioning works. Consideration should be given to temporarily marking or fencing off the round barrow site during the construction phase to ensure that vehicular access does not impact on the monument.
- 7.12 Given the proximity of the Highfield round barrow, Broadway hillfort and nearby Pilscornwell and Holgan hillforts (IDs 4 & 12) and the putative Roman Road at Broadway (ID 95), a watching brief might be considered necessary on the groundworks for the turbine base and cable trench at the proposed development site. The presence of a cluster of important archaeological features in the surrounding area indicate considerable past use of the local landscape. This elevates the potential for presently unknown archaeological features to be preserved beneath the ploughsoil in the vicinity, in particular for further features associated with the round barrow.






Figure 3: Assessment of the impact of the proposed turbine at Highfield on the recorded historic assets

8. Conclusion

- 8.1 It is not thought that there are any requirements for archaeological mitigation relating to any aspect of the proposed turbine site at Drim Farm.
- 8.2 Some mitigation may be considered necessary for the proposed turbine site at Highfield. In view of the proximity of the Highfield round barrow (ID number 32), Broadway hillfort (ID number 5) and nearby Pilscornwell and Holgan hillforts (IDs 4 & 12) and the putative Roman Road at Broadway (ID 95), a watching brief might be considered necessary on the groundworks for the turbine base and cable trench at the proposed development site. The presence of a cluster of important archaeological features in the surrounding area indicate considerable past use of the local landscape and elevate the potential for buried archaeological features to be preserved beneath the ploughsoil.
- 8.3 The impact on the Bronze Age round barrow at Highfield (ID number 32) could include damage by vehicles crossing the field during construction as it lies between the access gates into the field and the proposed turbine site. The present landowner has acquired the field in relatively recent times and was unaware of the existence of the Highfield round barrow. Raising awareness of the monument with the landowner would in itself help mitigate against the monument suffering unnecessary damage during any construction phase, servicing works or decommissioning works. Consideration should be given to temporarily marking or fencing off the round barrow site during the construction phase to ensure that vehicular access does not impact on the monument.
- 8.4 The two proposed turbines do not create any cumulative impact on the local landscape as they are situated either side of a ridge of high ground and are neither intervisible, nor can they be viewed together from any position. There are also no other wind turbines visible in the local landscape.
