

## Introduction and historic background

The Dyfed Archaeological Trust (DAT) was consulted by Glastir contract manager Peter John on 20/12/ 2013 regarding a HEF lying within an area proposed for Glastir Option 125 (Lowland unimproved neutral grassland - reversion (pasture)).

The HEF (PRN 22320) is the site of a post medieval cottage named as Ivy Bush Cottage on the 1<sup>st</sup> edition OS map of 1886. It is shown as a single cell structure with a small out-shut at the south end lying within small enclosure or garden. It no longer survives above ground and no trace is visible on recent aerial photographs. However a mature tree is growing at the site of the cottage which may mask surviving ruins or earthworks.

DAT has no objection to the proposed Glastir option as the grass land reversion has no detrimental impact on the site or setting of the cottage. Although the cottage no longer survives above ground level no invasive actions should take place within the area of the cottage over a depth of 200mm as this may disturb below ground archaeological remains damage any mechanical equipment striking buried stones.
