Long term Vision and Objectives

Describe your long term vision for the new planting

Ty'n-yr-helyg is a small-holding of 9.6 ha situated on a sheltered north-facing slope overlooking Cwm Mabws, about 11/2 miles south-east of Llanrhystud. The farm is registered for organic production, and the improved fields on the more level ground near the house support a rotation of organic vegetables, potatoes and grassland. The owner currently wishes to plant some of the fields to the north of the farm-house where the land slopes more steeply down to the wooded bank of the Afon Wyre Fach. The farm has a long history of managing for biodiversity.

The woodlands at Ty'n-yr-helyg will complement the organic farm and contribute to the Ancient Semi Natural Woodland element in the landscape. The new native woodlands will be designed to integrate with the patchwork of wooded gullies and mature field boundaries.

4. Design of new planting

Brief description of new planting site	The new planting is on unimproved grazing land. The planting area is on a steep slope. The altitude is 132 meters above sea level, close to the sea at Llanrhystud, but sheltered by mature hedgerows and by the side of Cwm Mabws. The area at the top of the slope, closest to the house, levels off and is less well drained and prone to being wet.
Pre-planting ground preparation	Ground preparation will consist of cutting back rushes and scarification to loosen the turf and ease rooting.
Design of new planting scheme	Native Woodland – Carbon: Sessile oak 20%, Downy birch 20%, Alder 15%, Wild cherry 10%, Small leaved lime 10%, Aspen 5%, Crab apple 5%, Hazel 5%, Bird cherry 5%, and Alder buckthorn 5%. Planting will be in groups of intimate mixtures designed to reflect variations in site conditions. The wet area will be planted with an alder, birch mixture. Light demanding species will be concentrated around the edges of the new planting and take existing hedge or isolated trees into account. Oak will be on the steep slope while small leaved lime will be concentrated on areas with deeper soil. The area close the Water vole layer will have a species mixture in accordance with the guidelines. The new scheme will be registered with the Woodland Carbon Code.
Type of planting stock and size of trees/shrubs	The trees and shrubs will be 1+1 nursery stock (bare rooted). Size of the trees – 40-60 cm; size of shrubs – 30-45 cm. Trees will be planted into mulch mats.
Tree protection – what type of tree shelters/spiral guards will be used and why?	In areas where there is evidence of rabbits, protection will be with spiral guards.
Fencing (livestock)	The fencing will comply with the Glastir fencing specification. There will be a mix of new fencing and fence replacement around the new planting.
Deer protection (if an issue)	No
Open ground	Drip lines around established hedge lines within the field area will be left unplanted and included within the permissible 15% unmapped open ground <0.1 ha in size. The average planting distance will be adjusted to accommodate 2,500 plants per gross hectare.
Is the new planting within an open access area?	No
Are standing trees present?	Standing trees consist of old hedgerows on the edge of, or within, some of the field areas. No planting will take place within 2 metres of a dripline.
Timing of new planting	Subject to approval, planting will take place from autumn 2017 and over winter to Spring 2018, weather permitting. Fencing will precede the planting.

6. Stakeholder statement

The smallholding is in a remote location outside of Llanrhystud with no Public Rights of Way crossing the property. Informal consultation has taken place with neighbours and with local inhabitants.

I will allow duly authorised officers of the Welsh Government, or their duly authorised agents, access to any land or any woodland areas included in the Woodland Creation Plan in order to inspect the land, any relevant equipment, storage facilities and records (including computer records), and any other aspect of the land within the Woodland Creation Plan in order to verify the accuracy of the information in this application, and I will give them all reasonable assistance for that purpose.

I understand that if my application is successful, I will be required to enter into a Glastir Woodland Creation Contract and payment of any grant funding will be conditional on compliance with the terms of that contract. If I am offered a contract and do not enter into the agreement, or fulfil the terms of the contract I may be excluded form re-applying for Glastir Woodland Creation for the following two calendar years.
