4. Design of new planting

Brief description of new planting site	The new planting is on a mix of upland, semi-improved acid grassland and wet unimproved acid grassland used for sheep grazing. Altitude ranges between 155m and 165m a.s.l. Slopes vary from better drained moderate slopes to areas of flat, wetter ground. Soils are upland brown earth, gley and peaty gleys. The new areas of planting dividing field areas require new fences and fencing in poor condition is to be replaced.
Pre-planting ground preparation	Ground preparation will be by excavator mounding.
Design of new planting scheme	Native Woodland – Carbon: General species mixture: Sessile oak 20%, Downy birch 20%, Wild cherry 10%, Small leaved lime 10%, Rowan 10%, Common alder 5%, Aspen 5%, Crab apple 5%, Bird cherry 5%, Alder buckthorn 5% and Holly 5%.
	Planting will be in groups of intimate mixtures designed to reflect variations in the site conditions. Light demanding species will be concentrated around the edges of the new planting and take existing hedge or isolated trees into account. Streamside planting will be alder and shrub species.
	The new scheme will be registered with the Woodland Carbon Code.
	Plant numbers will be calculated at a density of 2,500 plants per gross hectare. Spacing will be adjusted to account for unmapped open ground, ponds, isolated trees, edge effect and unplanted wayleaves.
Type of planting stock and size of trees/shrubs	The trees and shrubs will be 1+1 nursery stock (bare rooted) except holly (cell grown). Size of the trees will be 40-60 cm; size of shrubs will be 30-45 cm.
Tree protection – what type of tree shelters/spiral guards will be used and why?	Native Woodland – Carbon Broadleaves will be protected with spiral guards and canes if pests are known to be on the new planting areas.
Fencing (livestock)	The fencing will comply with the Glastir fencing specification. There will be a mix of new fencing and fence replacement around the new planting areas.
Deer protection (if an issue)	No.
Open ground	Established hedge lines and existing ponds within the field area will be left unplanted and included within the permissible 15% unmapped open ground <0.1 ha in size. The average planting distance will be adjusted to accommodate 2,500 plants per gross hectare. Riparian buffer zones will be a mix of open ground and group planting of mixed native species at 2.5m spacing. Similar buffer zones will extend around ponds or permanent water features.

Are standing trees present?	Small numbers of standing trees are present in old hedgerow banks on the edge of, or within, some of the field areas. Transplants will not be planted within 2 metres of the dripline around established tree crowns.

Timing of new planting	Subject to approval, planting will take place from autumn 2018 and over winter to spring 2019, weather permitting. Fencing will precede planting.

I undertake to keep for a period of 10 years from the date of the final payment, and to provide officers of the Welsh Government or their duly authorised agents, within such period as they may determine, such records and information as may be required in respect of this application and in order to determine my compliance with these declarations and undertakings. I agree to repay any aid received together with any interest, if I am asked to do so by the Welsh Government, as a consequence of a breach of any rule, declaration made or undertaking given in this application. I agree to repay, on demand, any overpayments made to me as a result of a miscalculation by the Welsh Government or otherwise.

I will allow duly authorised officers of the Welsh Government, or their duly authorised agents, access to any land or any woodland areas included in the Woodland Creation Plan in order to inspect the land, any relevant equipment, storage facilities and records (including computer records), and any other aspect of the land within the Woodland Creation Plan in order to verify the accuracy of the information in this application, and I will give them all reasonable assistance for that purpose.

I understand that if my application is successful, I will be required to enter into a Glastir Woodland Creation Contract and payment of any grant funding will be conditional on compliance with the terms of that contract. If I am offered a contract and do not enter into the agreement, or fulfil the terms of the contract I may be excluded form re-applying for Glastir Woodland Creation for the following two calendar years.

I understand that the use of an agent or Management Planner does not affect my personal responsibility for the accuracy of the information provided in this application, nor does it absolve me of responsibility to comply with the terms of any contract should my application be successful.

I understand that I must not commence project activity, before I have received written confirmation from the Welsh Government to do so. Any expenditure incurred before the approval date is at my own risk and may render the project ineligible for support.

I have read the Fair Processing Notice of the Glastir Woodland Creation Rules Booklet. I understand that the Welsh Ministers may share, publish or disclose information, including personal information, about my Glastir Woodland Creation application and Woodland Creation Plan with other organisations. I agree to any necessary disclosure or exchanges of information and this extends to the use of information which is created or obtained in connection with my application (including details of payments made to me/my business).

I understand that the publication and disclosure of information by the Welsh Government will be in accordance with the obligations and duties under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, the Data Protection Act 1998, the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 and Commission Regulation (EC) 908/2014. I understand that the Welsh Government may produce and publish maps showing the areas of land that have been brought into the agreements and other information provided may also be disclosed where permitted by law.

I understand that the Welsh Government may also obtain information about me from other organisations, or provide information about me to them, in order to verify the accuracy of the information, prevent or detect crime and protect public funds.
