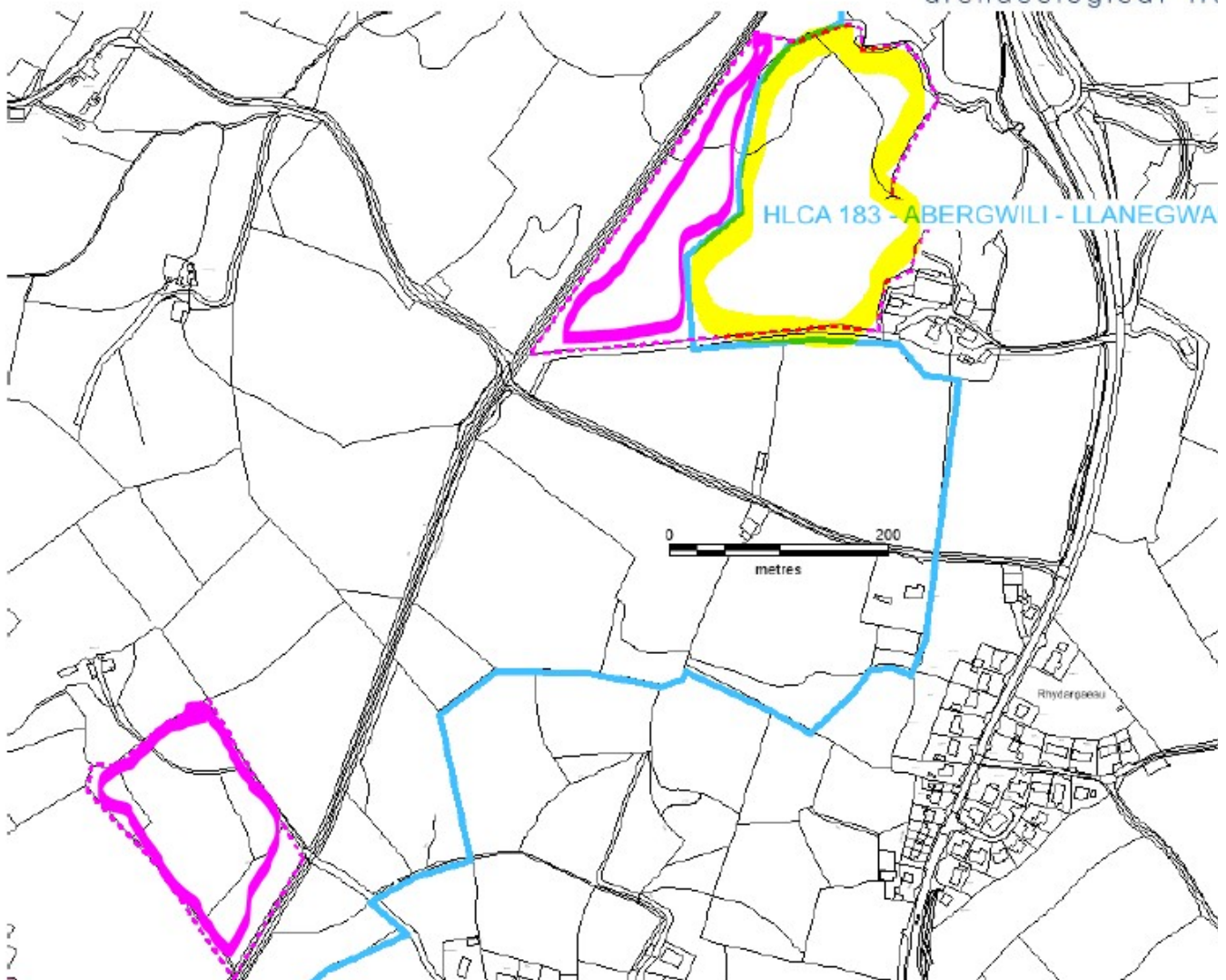
It would be useful to know more about your design process,

Hi Alice,

Thank you for your response, which we note. For clarification, the map shows that the northern piece of land earmarked for planting (highlighted in yellow below) is within the HLCA area, but that part of this field, and the southern area (marked in magenta) aren't. The southern area is immediately adjacent to an existing 30 year old Sitka spruce plantation. So is your preference for 100% broadleaves **only** in the HLCA area, does it need buffering and it would therefore cover the whole site? The original plan had been to plant with a mixture of conifers and broadleaves.

If you could clarify please, I would be grateful. Thank you very much.

Thank you for forwarding this Glastir Woodland Creation proposal to us. I apologise for the late response. DAT have reviewed the new planting proposals for A0047609 Brynhyfryd against the Historic Environment Records database and other readily available record sources and have assessed that the application, as submitted, has the potential to have an impact upon the following Historic Landscape Character Area; Abergwili – Llanegwad HLCA 183. <https://dyfedarchaeology.org.uk/HLC/HLCTowy/area/area183.htm>

DAT therefore advise that in order to comply with UKFS Forests and the historic environment guidance, the following advice should be adhered to in the Glastir Woodland Creation plan:

- that within this Historic Landscape Character Area planting is predominantly deciduous species to reinforce the existing landscape character.

I am writing to inform you of a proposed tree planting scheme near Brynhyfryd (nearest postcode SA33 6BG), and welcome any comments that you may have regarding the scheme, with particular reference to field parcels including, adjoining or in the vicinity of registered archaeological features.

The area highlighted on the attached map has been selected as an area to be planted under the Glastir Woodland Creation scheme. The Glastir Woodland Creation scheme aims to maintain and enhance biodiversity, improve water quality, and combat climate change through targeted tree planting in Wales. This site has been selected for planting from a large volume of applications, as it has been recognised that tree planting in this area could have significant environmental benefits.

The intention is for the site to be planted with a diverse mixture of native broadleaved tree species and productive coniferous species.
