





Thank you for your consultation and apologies for the delay. I have reviewed the map boundaries against the regional Historic Environment Record (HER) and other sources and note that forestry operations have the potential to impact on the historic features noted below as well as the Historic Parkland of Glansevin, shown in green on the map below. The parkland is shown on historic maps as a mix of deciduous and coniferous trees.

PRN 47174 Tan y Fan
Post Medieval Cottage
SN74112819

The cottage site of Tan-Y-Fan is first shown on the first edition Ordnance Survey map of 1891 although its surrounding enclosure is identified on the Tithe Map of 1839. It appears again on the second edition Ordnance Survey map of 1907 but must have become abandoned at some point during the early 20th Century. The enclosure survives as a clearing within Allt y Fan and at the time of the site visit had been used for growing a crop of maize. The north boundary bank to this enclosure survives to a height of around 0.75 metres with a 3 - 4 metre wide trackway to the north of it. The exact cottage site is now a small copse.

The current condition of these features is unknown; however they may survive as ruins, earthworks or below ground archaeology. Therefore in order to comply with UKFS Forests and the historic environment guidance, DAT advise that these historic environment features (shown in green on the attached map) must be protected from damage during felling operations and subsequent restocking, and tracks and loading areas must not cross these areas.

There is always the possibility for previously unknown remains to survive within this area of which we have no knowledge. Should further archaeological features or finds be identified it is important that Dyfed Archaeological Trust Heritage Management is informed and further information and advice can then be provided as required.
