

Dear Miriam,

Firstly I must apologise for the delay with responding to this, unfortunately we've been short staffed over the summer and consequently my existing backlog has grown. Sorry it has taken so long. I note that you have identified one Historic Environment Feature PRN 21129, I also have a record of a further feature, another cottage, PRN 104136, details below. I note this one also lies outside of the proposed planting area.

Ideally these cottage features should be kept clear of damaging scrub growth if possible, to retain their visibility and reduce the chances of damage from falling trees/branches.

The consultation area lies outside of the registered historic landscapes and lies adjacent to the afforested areas of Brechfa forest, so I'm not concerned about the introduction of the various conifer species.

I would make one suggestion however, I note that you mention recreation and amenity and wonder if you will be encouraging access to the forest? If you are there are the courses of a number of footpaths/tracks marked on the historic Ordnance Survey maps, 1889 & 1907 (attached) which could be maintained as open access through the woods and link up with the existing PROW which runs NNE to SSW along the eastern boundary of the site.

Dear Alice,

I hope this finds you well and you're enjoying the lovely weather.

We have acquired a new site for the purpose of new woodland creation in your neck of the woods (SN 4935427719). This is part of the same programme as the Brownhill site which you are familiar with, which is to compensate for woodland lost from the WGWE for renewable energy developments. Please see details attached including the location plan and a draft woodland plan. If this isn't in your patch do let me know or pass it on.

Our data shows an historic environment record present on the site – see snip below. I believe this is a ruined cottage. The feature is not actually within our planting area, and planned planting will be (at the closest) around 30m from the site. We intend to leave the cwm in which the feature sits as open ground or to develop scrub/ successional woodland as it presently is.


