

Advice (If the proposal is considered to be inappropriate at this location please provide an explanation)	PRN 282 PEN CAE NEWYDD BRONZE AGE ROUND BARROW SN78932885 This robbed-out round cairn is located on a moorland ridge, the ground falling away steeply to the N and S, and more gently to the W. The stony mound measures 9m in diameter and 0.3m high and is composed of turf-covered loose stones and small boulders. It has been dug into and distorted on the NE side and has a generally disturbed appearance. Another cairn, a ring barrow (281) lies c.250m away to the NE, with further cairns to the E (278, 279 and 280). This site is located on the spine of a NE-SW running ridge and is now mainly overgrown with only a few stones visible. The turf covered wall foundations of small stones and boulders		



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	 indicate a building 8.5m in length orientated WSW-ENE-, and 6.5m in width. There is a subdividing wall 2.5m form the east end and a possible extension 2.5m further west is likely, though no walling is visible. The entrance was probably on the north side. Except at the SE corner where a mound of stone reaches 0.6m in height, elsewhere the walling does not exceed 0.1m in height. https://archwilio.org.uk/arch/query/page.php?watprn=DAT283 The application lies within the Registered Historic Landscape Black Mountain & Mynydd Myddfai HLW (D) 1, and Historic Landscape Character Area of The Black Mountain - Y Mynydd Ddu. https://dyfedarchaeology.org.uk/HLC/Myddfai/area/area240.htm In addition to those features listed above, the wider area is rich with archaeology including 3 prehistoric scheduled monuments, CM351, CM349 and CM350, located nearby. We recommend that a site visit is carried out to assess the impact of proposed planting on the historic landscape character and specific historic environment features. Further advice can then be provided.
