Thank you for your felling licence consultation. I have reviewed the map boundaries against the regional Historic Environment Record (HER) and other sources and note the following features.

PRN25836 CIL-OLWD POST MEDIEVAL LEAD MINE SN6209287830 Level (Lead) recorded on 1st and 2nd Edition Ordnance Survey Map. A. Powell, 2024.

Compartment 6b

PRN130849 POST MEDIEVAL WELL SN6227287886 Well recorded on 1st and 2nd Ordnance Survey Map. A. Powell 2024.

PRN63066 CIL-OLWG POST MEDIEVAL LEAD MINE SN6223687797 A level forming part of Cil-Olwg lead mine (PRN 25836), recorded on the Ordnance Survey 1st edition map of 1888. It is marked as disused on the Ordnance Survey 2nd edition map (1905). W. Steele. Added to HER by A. Powell 2024.



The current condition of these features is unknown; however, they may survive as a ruin, earthworks or below ground archaeology. We advise that the historic environment features (labelled on the maps above and marked with a green polygon and or red dot) are protected from damage during forest operations, to comply with UKFS Forests and the historic environment guidance.

There is always the possibility for previously unknown remains to survive within this area of which we have no knowledge.
