FLA 145 24-25 Penarth Farm

Thank you for consulting us on the felling licence application for Penarth Farm. I have reviewed the map boundaries against the regional Historic Environment Record (HER) and other sources and have identified the following (illustrated on the attached map in purple):

Recorded Historic Environment Features within the Consultation Area

- **PRN 28265 – Post Medieval Coal Workings** (SN1288207945): An 'Old Shaft' is marked on 1:2500 1891 1st ed. OS map. One of a number of former 19th century coal mining shafts located to the north of Lower Level Colliery, Pembrokeshire. F Murphy 2015.

Recorded Historic Environment Features immediately adjacent to the Consultation Area

- **PRN 28266 – Post Medieval Coal Workings** (SN127082): A coal mine. One of several coal working sites in the vicinity of Kilgetty Wood. Not visited during 2015 fieldwork. A.Day. March 2015.

Recommendations

1. Protection of Identified Features:

To avoid any damage to these features during forestry operations, including



fellings, tracking machinery, and restocking, we advise excluding these areas from forestry activities.

2. **Observation and Reporting:**

there is always the possibility of encountering previously unknown archaeological remains. Should any new archaeological features or finds be identified during the work, please inform Heneb – The Trust for Welsh Archaeology, Heritage Management (Dyfed region), so that we can provide further guidance if needed.
