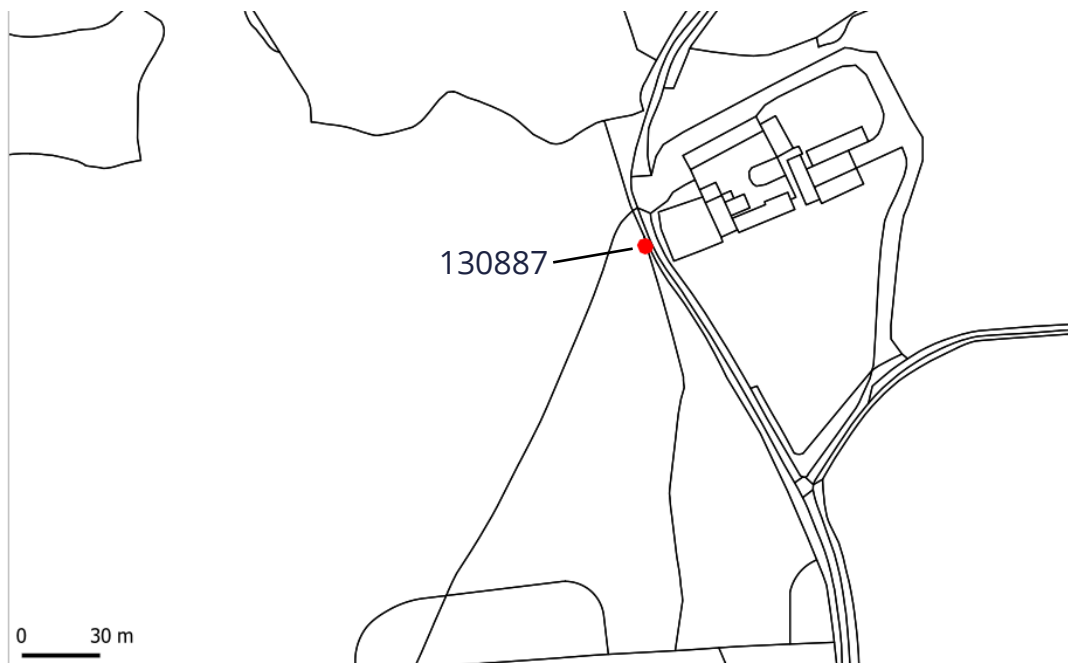
NRW Screening Request FLA171 24-25 Iscoed

I also note the following feature.

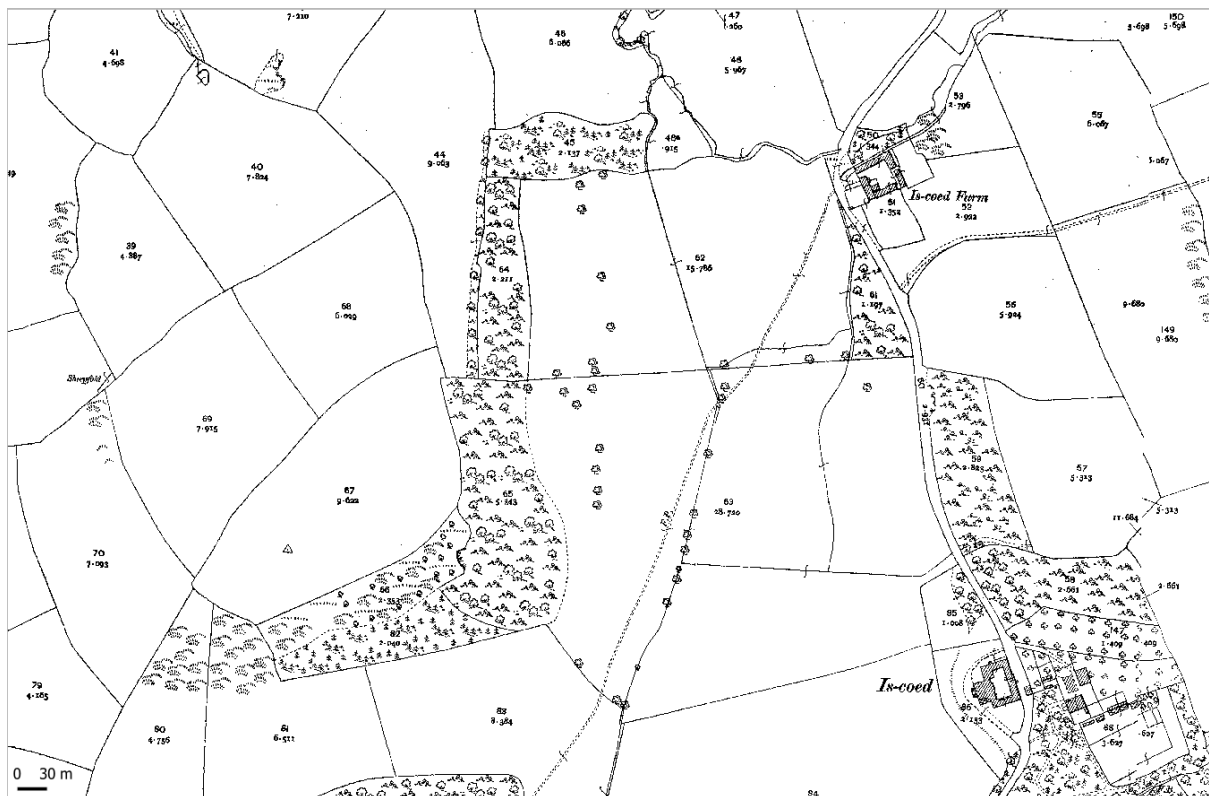
PRN130887 ISCOED HOME FARM POST MEDIEVAL OUTBUILDING SN3821311800

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We advise that this historic environment feature (labelled on the map above and marked with a red spot) is protected from damage during forest operations, to comply with UKFS Forests and the historic environment guidance.

The application also lies within the unregistered parkland of the Iscoed Mansion. The historic maps record the area due for clear fell and restocking, as broadleaf woodland.



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There is always the possibility for previously unknown remains to survive within this area of which we have no knowledge. Should further archaeological features or finds be identified it is important that Heneb – The Trust for Welsh Archaeology, Heritage Management Dyfed region is informed and further information and advice can then be provided as required.

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
