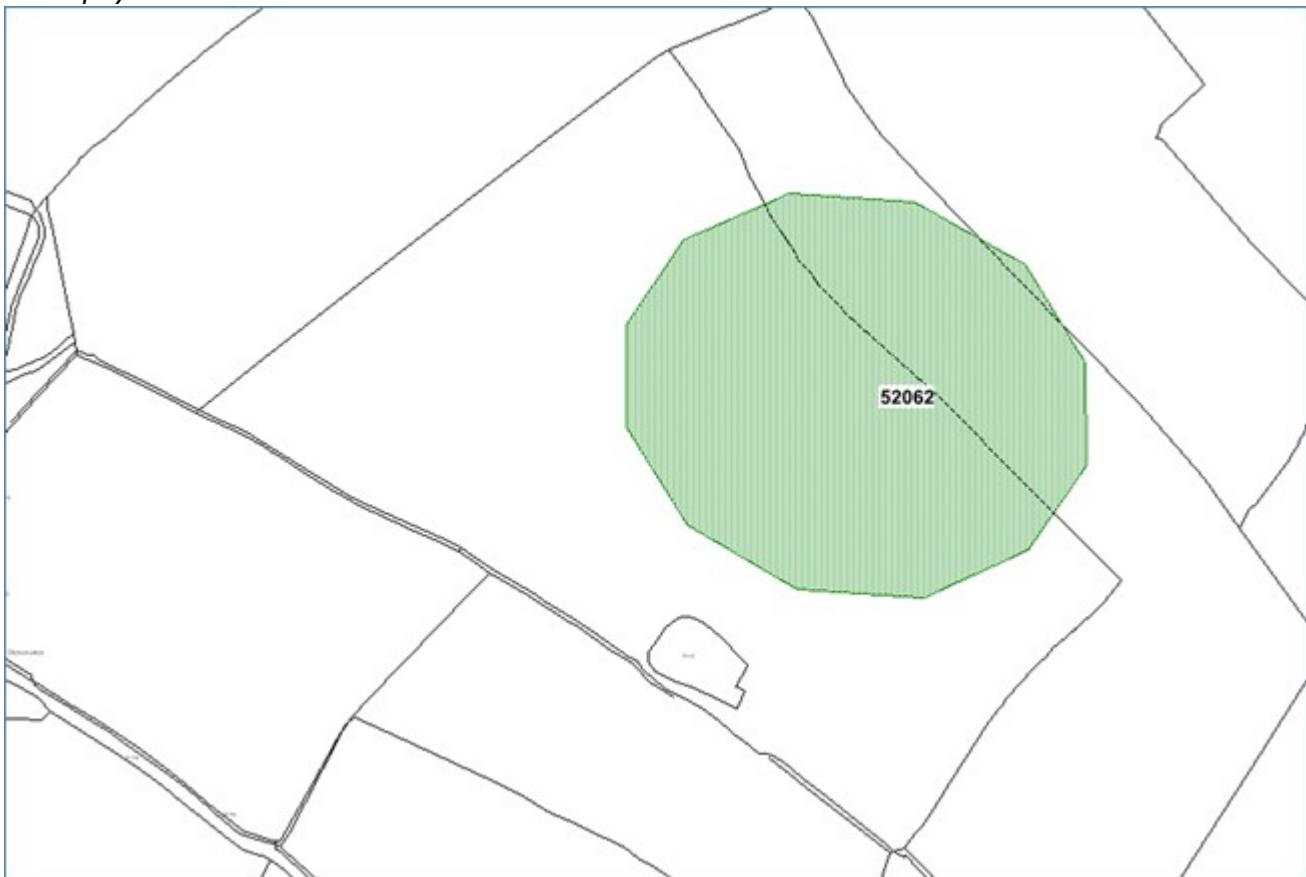
Site Type (preferred type first) : Iron Age Defended Enclosure

Summary :

Located at approximately 60m above sea level on a gentle northwest-facing coastal slope with views over Cardigan Island and the Irish Sea, Clos-y-Ynys defended enclosure is a cropmark site with no earthwork or other surface evidence. At the time of the site visit the land was under barley stubble.

Aerial photographs show a concentric ditched enclosure. The inner enclosure is circular approximately 40m in diameter. Owing to geological/crop conditions it is not a continuous cropmark. However, the entrance may lie on the southeast, up-slope, side. The cropmark of the outer ditch only shows on the south and west sides. It is concentric to the inner enclosure, c. 30m - 40m distant from it. It has a west-facing entrance.
