

117039	A reservoir is recorded on the 1st edition Ordnance Survey map located to the west of Castle Hill farmstead (1888). The map indicates a bank around the west side of the reservoir and a sluice is identified to the south. It is not clear from the historic maps if this supplied water for farm machinery in the farmstead or was a water supply for the mansion. A linear earthwork feature curving round from the southeast may be a leat supplying the reservoir (PRN 121910). The reservoir is still identified on the 2nd edition OS map (905). 43839	A stone built well is situated on the south west side of the road to the south of the house (plate 4). The well is stone built with an internal circular cistern and a large slate capstone. The north west side of the structure is beginning to collapse.(Pyper,A.2002)	Well	SN62567458
43853	A small, square, building is recorded on the historic maps (tithe, 1st and 2nd edition Ordnance Survey (1844, 1888 & 1905). It may be a building associated with the kitchen garden (PRN 43844). A Pyper 2019	Cottage;GARDEN BUILDING	SN62517451
121910	A leat suppling a reservoir at Castle Hill is recorded on the 1st and 2nd edition Ordnance Survey maps. A Pyper 2020.	LEAT	SN62867411

The current condition of these features is unknown, however they may survive as ruins, earthworks or below ground archaeology. Felling operations should avoid causing damage in these areas.

There is always the possibility for previously unknown remains to survive within this area of which we have no knowledge. Should further archaeological features or finds be identified it is important that Dyfed Archaeological Trust Heritage Management is informed and further information and advice can then be provided as required.
