FLA 318 20-21 Little Hall and Green Grove near Llandovery

Thank you for your consultation. I have checked the map boundaries against the regional Historic Environment Record (HER) and other sources and note the following historic environment features, which may be affected by the felling proposals;

A footbridge is recorded on the 1st and 2nd edition OS maps, 1886 and 1905 and mentioned by Francis Jones in 1938. RPS Dec.2002

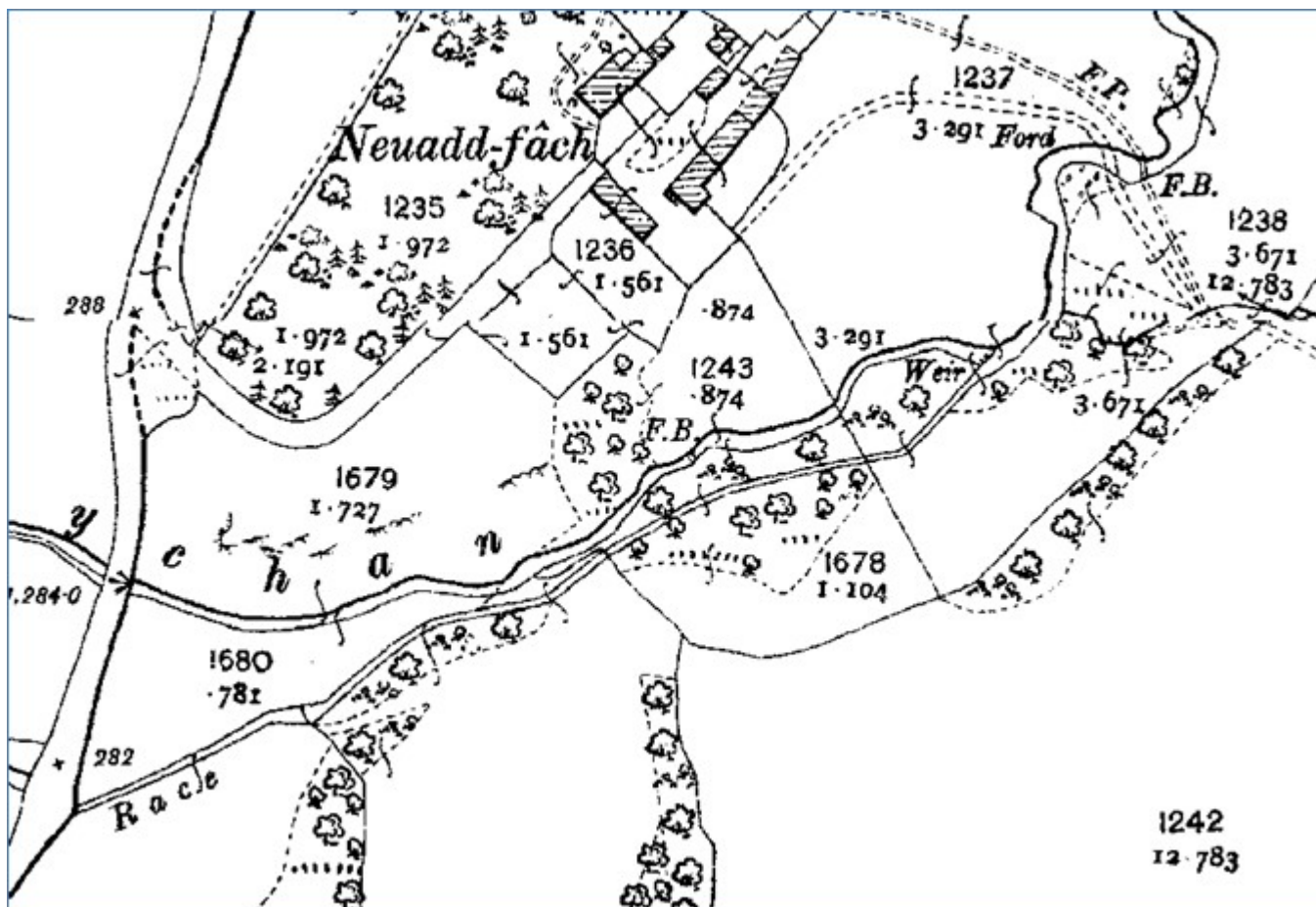
Description

A weir is recorded on the 1st and 2nd edition Ordnance Survey maps, 1888 & 1905. The weir directs water from the Afon Crychan into a mill race which supplied the Aber Crychan Corn Mill PRN 21909. Marked as a sluice on the 1st edition. A Pyper 2020.

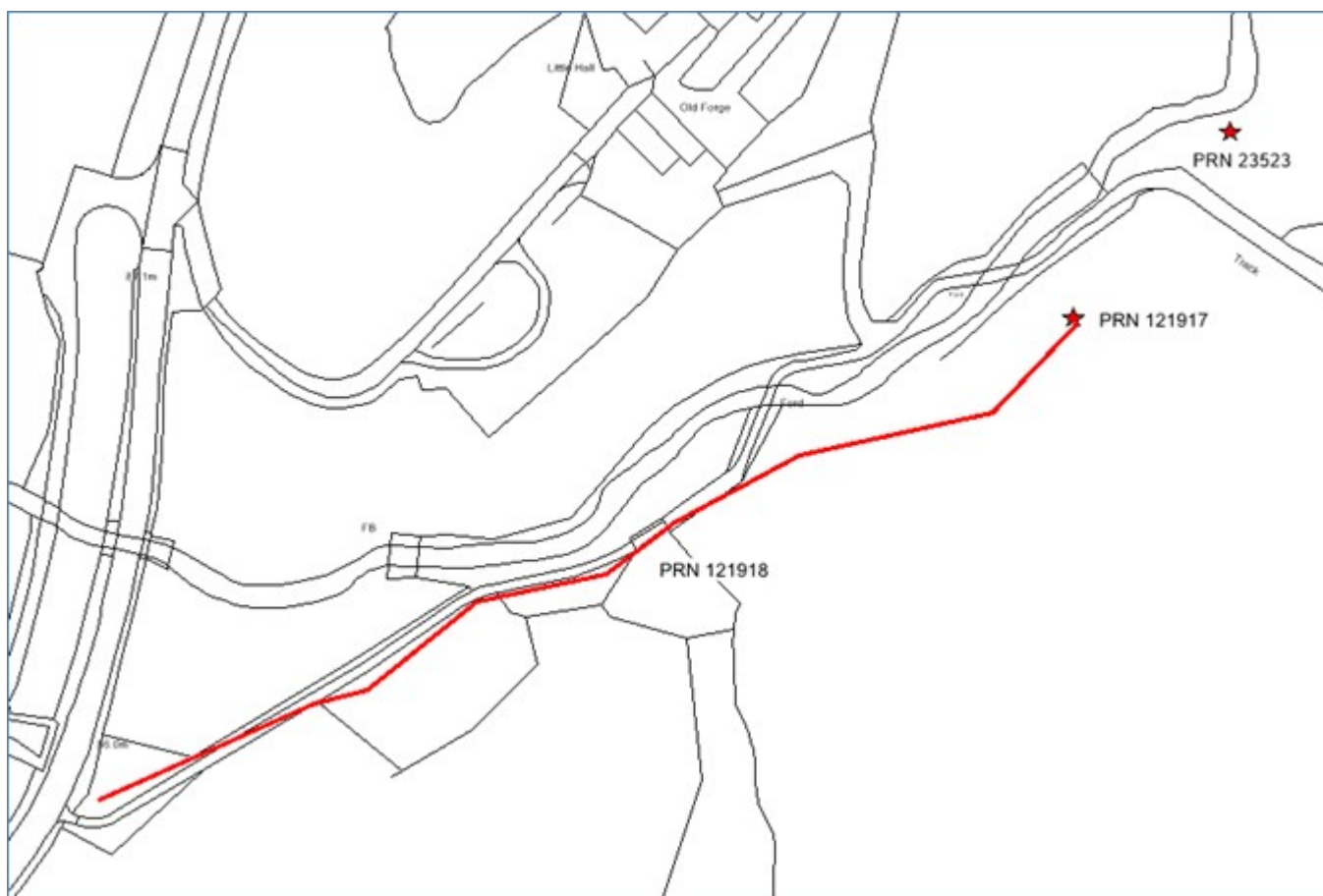
Description
