4. Design of Proposed Planting

Deer protection (if an issue)	Deer protection will not be used.
Fencing (livestock)	Existing fences of good quality will be maintained as stockproof. Where no fencing exists or is in poor condition, new livestock fencing will be erected and maintained to WCPS specification which may be up to 1663m of P595.
Tree protection – what type of tree shelters/spiral guards will be used and why?	It is expected that 60cm tree wraps will be used on broadleaf trees to protect them from rabbits.
Type of planting stock and size of trees/shrubs	 Conifers: 20-50cm transplant stock 1u1 or 1+1. Broadleaves: 30-60cm transplant stock 1/0, 1u1 or 1+1. Above subject to availability of appropriate provenance.
Design of proposed planting scheme	This is a landscape scale design; not by field parcel. See planting design map. The proposed planting areas will provide shelterbelts and are aligned with existing field boundaries to be in keeping with the landscape pattern. Broadleaves will be planted to soften the hard, visible edges of the planting where possible in line with UKFS guidelines and will increase biodiversity value. Hedgerows will have a 3m unplanted buffer and a 2m buffer of woody shrubs adjacent to this.
Pre-planting ground preparation <u>* hover for requirements</u>	 Ground preparation The planting site may be prepared by mounding using an excavator prior to planting – 2m between mounds. Control of weeds may be undertaken with herbicides prior to planting. The purpose of the ground preparation work is to ensure the rapid establishment of the young trees minimising the duration and quantity of herbicide use. European Protected Species (EPS) potential presence There are no records of EPS within 2km of the site (NBN Atlas). Should any EPS be observed on site, method statements for all operations likely to impact on EPS will be agreed with the NRW species team prior to work commencing if appropriate. A schedule of operations will be created, and the species team kept informed as necessary.
Brief description of proposed planting site	The proposal is located 2.5km to the east of the village of Rhos-goch / Red Roses and 6km to south-west of the town of St Clears. Bedrock: Milford Haven Group - Argillaceous rocks and sandstone and conglomerate, interbedded. Sedimentary bedrock formed between 427.4 and 407.6 million years ago during the Silurian and Devonian periods. Soils: Freely draining slightly acid loamy soils. Elevation: Varies from 110 – 170m above sea level.

Post planting: Treatment will be carried out until the trees are established and out competing the surrounding vegetation. The expectation is for a minimum of 2 growing seasons in the conifer areas and a minimum of 3 growing seasons in the broadleaf areas. Spot weeding of the trees to a 1m diameter in April/May. Selective treatment of bracken, bramble, gorse, grasses, and any weeds and will be carried out when necessary during growing seasons. Herbicide will be applied by a qualified contractor – NPTC PA1, PA6 and PA6AW. (Any herbicide use will follow strict UKFS Forest and Water guidelines).
Tree replacement	Losses will be replaced with a species mix that maintains the overall approved species percentages/mix and ensures full stocking of 2500/Ha.	Agent or owner will instruct a contractor to undertake operation.	Tree losses will be checked annually, and trees replaced to maintain the planting option stocking density for 12 years and/or the lifetime of the agreement, whichever is longer.
Fencing	Boundary fences to be maintained as stockproof for duration of the contract.	Agent or owner will instruct a contractor to carry out repairs or replacement.	Fencing will be checked at least once annually, for 12 years and/or the lifetime of the agreement, whichever is longer.
