### **EIA (Agriculture) Regulations - Consultation Request**

#### **T035 2024 Llandovery**

Thank you for your consultation. I have reviewed the map boundaries against the regional Historic Environment Record (HER) and other sources. I note that the application lies within the Historic Landscape Character Area of Cynghordy, which is part of the Historic Landscape Area of the Towy Valley. I also note the presence of the following historic feature within the area:

**PRN33986**

**Tir-Isaf, Road**

**SN75883706**

This is an interrupted segment of the Roman road RR62c (PRN 51972) from Llandovery to Pumsaint, running between SN75643730 and SN75893706. It lies to the east of the modern road but follows a similar course, likely passing to the west of the defended Iron Age enclosure Troed-y-Rhw (PRN 33988). While this particular section of the Roman road is not scheduled, a section approximately 500 metres to the south is.

The Roman road is a significant historical feature, despite not being scheduled. Its proximity to other scheduled sections highlights its potential importance. We have no current evidence regarding the condition of this section of the road. Given its historical value, we recommend further archaeological assessment to determine its state and ensure its preservation. We would be happy to discuss the requirements for this assessment with you.
