Ar 14 Rhagfyr 2018, cadarnhaodd Cyngor Sir Penfro y gorchymyn uchod.

Effaith y gorchymyn, fel y'i cadarnhawyd, fydd dargyfeirio'r rhan honno o lwybr troed cyhoeddus SP10/24 yng nghymuned Amroth gan ddechrau o bwynt A (Cyfeirnod Grid SN18111042) mewn cyfeiriad gorllewinol am ryw 32 metr i bwynt B (Cyfeirnod Grid SN18071043), yna i gyfeiriad cyffredinol de-orllewinol am ryw 52 metr i bwynt C (Cyfeirnod Grid SN18031039), fel y dengys ar fap y gorchymyn gan linell du trwm parhaus, i linell sy'n dechrau o bwynt E (Cyfeirnod Grid SN18091047) ar hyd llwybr fferm i gyfeiriad cyffredinol gorllewin de-orllewinol am ryw 65 metr i bwynt F (Cyfeirnod Grid SN18021045) yna'n dilyn ymyl y cae mewn cyfeiriad cyffredinol de-ddwyreiniol yna i gyfeiriad cyffredinol de-orllewinol am ryw 63 metr i bwynt C (Cyfeirnod Grid SN18031039), fel y nodwyd ar fap y gorchymyn gan linell du trwm toredig. Mae'r llwybr a grëwyd yn 2 fetr o led a rhyw 128 metr o hyd.

Mae copi o'r gorchymyn fel y'i cadarnhawyd a map y gorchymyn wedi'u gosod a gellir eu gweld yn rhad ac am ddim yn yr Is-adran Cynllunio Datblygu, y Gyfarwyddiaeth Ddatblygu, Cyngor Sir Penfro, Neuadd y Sir, Hwlfordd, o 9.00 a.m. i 5.00 p.m. ar ddiwrnodau'r wythnos waith. NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF AN ORDER
HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 119
THE PEMBROKESHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL
FOOTPATH SP10/24 (part) IN THE COMMUNITY OF AMROTH
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

On the 14th December 2018 Pembrokeshire County Council confirmed the above order.

The effect of the order as confirmed will divert that part of public footpath SP10/24 in the community of Amroth commencing from point A (Grid Reference SN18111042) in a westerly direction for approximately 32 metres to point B (Grid Reference SN18071043) then in a generally south westerly direction for approximately 52 metres to point C (Grid Reference SN18031039), as shown on the order map by a continuous bold black line, to a line commencing from point E (Grid Reference SN18091047) along a farm track in a generally west south westerly direction for approximately 65 metres to point F (Grid Reference SN18021045) then following the field margin in a generally south south easterly direction then generally south westerly for approximately 63 metres to point C (Grid Reference SN18031039), as marked on the Order map by a broken bold black line.

A copy of the order as confirmed and the order map have been placed and may be seen free of charge at the Pembrokeshire County Council, County Hall, Haverfordwest, from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on working weekdays. Copies of the order and map may be bought there at the price of £2.68.

The order came into force on the 21st December 2018, but if a person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of Highways Act 1980, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the 9th January 2019, make an application to the High Court.
