- II This terrace comprises half a hotel built in 1770 and originally called the Eagle + Child Hotel but also referred to as the English House. "The Duke of Wellington and other prominent figures stayed there en route for Ireland". After a visit by George IV in 1821 it was renamed the Royal Hotel. It was converted into houses in the late C19, after the Station Hotel was built. Two storeys. 8 windows. Cemented rendered slate roof. Glazing bars intact on 1st floor. 4 bay windows on ground floor added when the hotel was converted into houses. The end window bay on the left has 3 storeys + is stuccoed. This was originally the central feature. Carriage archway on ground floor at right hand end
