Outstanding Conservation Area

- II 1808. Erected by Lord Pulteney on site of Elizabethan Hall. Two storey. On ground floor - five arched bays of dressed stone with projecting springers. Painted stucco upper part with strip at 1st floor sill level, dentilled eaves and slate roof. Five tall windows on first floor in painted rusticated surround with triple keystones. The ground floor has a recessed porch in L.H. arch with pair of 6 panel double doors with arched lanterns over. These are apparently of later date, one pair forming entrance to a narrow passage to a later stair. The original passage was probably same width as one arch. The R.H. arch has a footway from Castle St. to beach through it. The three central arches have shop fronts each of four panel door with four pane rectangular fanlight, glazed shop window to R.H. and red brick

farlight over all. The central shop front is original slate, others which have been altered should be restored to the former and very effective design, when possible? The uterus has a fine for fine run of plain design.
