Probably early C19. Local stone structure with some dressed copings. Modern steel girder and steel plate towpath. Boxed gearing mechanism on towpath side. Steel pole handrail.

The water served a mill situated below the canal and shown on the GWR-Swansea canal map of 1874.

The buildings are adjacent to the canal and what may have been a Wharf, now rebuilt in concrete.



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
