Remains of a lime kiln. Probably late C18. Limestone rubble-stone arched kiln face and stone lined circular vertical shaft.

The kiln was probably constructed for lime for the construction of the canal - including Nant Du aqueduct, although it might have been built for the Ynysmewdwy Pottery (on the opposite bank of the canal) which opened in 1845.
