Iron foundry opened in 1865, but substantially rebuilt/extended mid-late C20. Foundry buildings now of concrete block and brick construction with gabled asbestos panel roof over casting house and other areas. Flat roofed offices at front of building, metal clad furnace stack. Remains of brick buildings within foundry yard. The foundry is adjacent to the canal, although no wharf exists.
