Llanunwas, or Porth y Rhaw
Camp and Holed Stone

Fenton, 135. Jones & Freeman's History and Antiquities of St. David's, 29. Arch. Camb. IV, 6, 83. In the ditch outside the camp will be found a broken stone worthy of note. The stone when entire measured 34 x 36 ins by 16 thick. On either side is a bored hole, the outer edge of one side is 6 ins in diameter, and the one on the opposite side of the same dimension, and both holes are about 8 ins deep. The holes are nearly opposite, but the holes do not meet. Is this an attempt to make a holed stone, which failed through the breaking of the stone? Prof. Rhys believes Rhaw to be related to Rhwyf (Oars) and that PORTH Y RHAW would there mean "Port of the Oared Boats".
