I refer to your application dated 30 May 2013, for scheduled monument consent to replace poles at the site of the above scheduled ancient monument.

You declined the opportunity of appearing before, and being heard by, a person appointed for that purpose, afforded to you by Cadw in the letter dated 19 June 2013. Nor have you submitted any further representations in support of your case.

The proposed works can be carried out without detriment to the historic or archaeological integrity of the monument. Accordingly, the Welsh Government hereby grants scheduled monument consent for the works described at paragraph 4 of the application dated 19 June 2013, subject to the following conditions:

- that Cadw shall be given at least two weeks notice, in writing, of the date of the commencement of the work or of any subsequent adjustment to this date, to allow Cadw's representatives to monitor on site activity;
- 2. that access to the site shall be afforded to representatives of Cadw:
- 3. that the existing poles shall be winched vertically from their holes and not dug out;
- 4. that the new poles shall be positioned in the existing post holes;

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5. that working vehicles and machinery shall be restricted to the southern edge of the scheduled area, along the line of the poles. Under the guidance of Cadw's monitoring Field Monument Warden care shall be taken to avoid damaging upstanding earthworks or ground disturbance and shall call a halt to the works should this begin to occur. To this end works shall not be undertaken when ground conditions are wet:

6. that all contractors shall be informed of the scheduled status of the site and the restrictions that it carries with it:

7. that the site is left in a stable and tidy condition;

8. that any modification to the proposed work shall require the written approval of Cadw, before it is undertaken; and

9. that Cadw shall be informed in writing immediately upon the completion of the works

Section 2(6) of the 1979 Act provides that non-compliance with a condition attached to a grant of scheduled monument consent shall be an offence.

By virtue of Section 4 of the 1979 Act if no works to which this consent relates are executed or started within 5 years from the date of this letter, the consent shall cease to have effect at the end of that period (unless it is revoked in the meantime).

This letter does not convey any approval or consent required under any enactment, bylaw, order or regulation other than Section 2 of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

Your attention is drawn to the enclosed note (SMC19) which sets out your right to challenge the above decision.
