- Part Three (this document) is a detailed Site Gazetteer, in which full descriptions of all of the sites recorded in the field are presented in numerical order (by NPRN).


The layout of the report is self-explanatory; the site location maps and key (49 figures in total) precede the printout of the Site Gazetteer on page 51.

Description: The history of this recorded site is rather confused. On the Llanerfyl sheet of the Original

Surveyors Drawing of 1832 the cairn on the top of Moel Eiddew, NPRN 303169, seems to be shown as well as a feature to its north northeast. On the 1 inch to 1 mile survey of 1836, the cairn on the top of Moel Eiddew is shown and also a feature to the north northeast called "Carnedd Cerrig" in the typeface used to label antiquities. On the 1st edition 1:2500 Ordnance Survey map of 1889, the cairn on Moel Eiddew is not shown, just the triangulation point, and the "Carnedd Cerig" is shown as what seems to be lines of scree from a central point. On the 1:10560 survey the same thing is shown with the addition of the word Cairn in brackets below the name Carnedd Cerig. In 1911 in the RCAHMW Inventory Carnedd Cerrig is recorded but said it was on the highest point of Moel Eiddew which is where cairn NPRN 303169 lies. On the ground at the point where Carnedd Cerig is shown on the maps is a lot of surface stone, but this extends over a much wider area and seems to be a natural feature although it is possible that there was a cairn which has since been removed. Description: This earthwork platform seems to have been first recorded by the Ordnance Survey in 1972,

although not mapped. It was visited by CPAT in 1989 when it was described as cut into a gentle northeast facing valley side near the head of the slope, 11 metres northeast to southwest by 6.7 metres, with a slight stone bank on the northeast and south, with a scatter of stone visible near the surface. It was noted that it was approached from the south by a hollow way in 2000, as a part of a Tir Gofal management plan. It was visited but not found due to dense bracken. A year later, as a part of the Cadw grant-aided pan-Wales Deserted Rural Settlements Project it was found and described as a house platform cut 1.2 metres deep into a moderate east-facing mid valley slopes and built up 0.6 metres at the east end. It measured 13.2 metres east to west by 8.2 metres wide, with a level area 7.4 metres by 4.4 metres. Isolated stones were visible suggesting a possible stone sill. Description: A round barrow is located at the edge of the summit of Cefn Llwyd, at a point where the ground falls away to the east. It measures 15 metres in diameter and 1.5 metres high on the east side, 1 metre to 1.2 metres elsewhere. The mound is turf covered but probing indicates a composition of earth and stone. At the time of the Ordnance Survey 1st edition mapping of the

composition of earth and stone. At the time of the Ordnance Survey 1st edition mapping of the area the mound was the site of a triangulation point. But apart from a slight depression towards its north-east side and a natural erosion scar on its south west, the barrow appears to be well preserved. Description: This hillfort occupies the summit of Pen y Gaer, to the south of Llyn Clywedog. It is defined

by stone ramparts. These are now just tumbled stone but traces of built structure were noted in 2005 by Toby Driver of the RACAHMW. They enclose an area approximately 68 metres north to south by 44 metres. The ground falls away steeply to the east and west and is gentler to the north. An additional rough stone wall lies 18 metres to the south of the enclosure, NPRN 534967, which seems to be an additional defence on a slightly gentler slope than the east and west. Previous field workers have recorded another wall 55 metres to the north of the enclosure but this was not seen on the ground in 2014. There are two entrances into the hillfort, one wider one at the north and a narrower oblique one in the southeast. The surface of the interior is uneven and internal features are not clear although it is possible there is a hut platform, NPRN 534966 towards the north, and Toby Driver in 2005 noted another level area with a rock-cut rear edge. More recent features include a marker cairn inside the hillfort, NPRN 534820, and another on the ramparts, NPRN 534767, as well as several shelters built into the ramparts, NPRNs 534773, 534774, 534775, 534818 and 534819. It is defined by earthwork ramparts, banks with a ditch downslope, although there is not one continuous circuit but almost a spiral. Several other detached banks to the northwest were recorded in 2014, NPRNs 535037, 535038, 535039 and thought to be outworks. A further bank NPRN 534738 was also thought to be related as again the ditch was downslope of the bank, similar to the ramparts but dissimilar to field boundaries

the north, east and south dropping steeply away. The land on the western side is far gentler and runs out onto a flatter area. The main enclosure is oval or subrectangular in plan and measures 120 metres north northeast to south southwest by approximately 70 metres. The defences on the western side are defined by an earthwork bank and ditch which is enhanced on either side of an inturned entrance way. The rest of the defences are slighter, NPRNs 534657 & 534652, and the eastern side has been interrupted by later quarrying, NPRN 534653.

The Giant's Grave Dyke lies on a long, flat-topped ridge on the eastern side of the Severn valley, southeast of Llandinam, Powys. It crosses a broad saddle, terminating at a steep-sided gully to the south, SO04438607 and a boggy area above a gully to the north, SO04378631. The central part of the dyke is the most clearly defined with an earthwork bank, up to 6 metres wide and 0.8 metres high, with a ditch on its western side, 2 to 3 metres wide and 0.4 metres deep and a smaller counterscarp bank up to 4 metres wide and 0.3 metres high.

In 2003, Clywd Powys Archaeological Trust excavated a trench across the dyke. The excavation revealed that material dug from the ditch was thrown up on the east side to form the material for the main bank. The original bank was thought to have been either up to 4.8 metres wide and at least 0.6 metres high. The ditch had a V-shaped profile with a square cut at its base and was originally 4 metres wide and up to 1.3 metres deep. The smaller bank on the west side of the bank may have been part of the original feature of the dyke but the excavators thought it more likely to represent material removed from the ditch when it was cleaned out. Peat that had been sealed by the bank was dated, by radio-carbon dating, to between 340 AD to 530 AD. J.J. Hall, Trysor, 26 March 2014

Description: Llys y Cawr hillfort on Allt Dolanog occupies a prominent outcrop towards the southwestern side of the common with a steep slope to the south level ground to the cost and a slight slope

side of the common with a steep slope to the south, level ground to the east and a slight slope to the north and west. The defensive earthworks create an oval enclosure roughly 180 metres northeast to southwest by 90 metres. The defences are most significant on the north and west sides where there are two banks in places, although the inner bank seems to be more an enhancement of a natural feature than a distinct feature. The area between the banks on the north side now holds water much of the time. The defences on the southern side where the slope below is much steeper are slighter. On the eastern side there is little change in slope between the hillfort and the ground to the east, but the defences here are quite slight. There is a entrance at SJ0649513330 about 5 metres wide flanked on either side by an earth mound. One at SJ0649613334 is 5 metres north to south by 4 metres and 1 metre high, and to its south, at SJ0649313321, is the other measuring 6.5 metres north to south by 5 metres and up to 1 metre high. Description: Aberdaunant is said to be an early mining site, but the mine continued to be worked into the

late 19th century and the layout of the lower part of the complex at the end of its working history is captured on the first edition of the 1:2,500 scale Ordnance Survey map of 1886. Most of the buildings, levels, shafts and spoil tips shown on this Ordnance Survey map are identifiable today, although few of the buildings are now represented by more than a levelled area or slight rubble. By 1881, Thomas senior had died and Mary was the head of the household with Thomas and Griffith still at home. Mary had died in the next decade as in 1891 Griffith the younger son was head of the household with his older brother Thomas and Elizabeth Williams (22) a housekeeper. 1901 saw another change with a John Owen (24) and Lucy (25) his wife and their daughter Gwalia (10 months) as well as Uncle Thomas, now 63. John and Lucy's family had expanded in 1911 to five children Gwalia (10), Ruhannah (9), Mwywen (8), Goronwy (4) and Deborah (1). They recorded their answers to the census in Welsh.
